










Framework Prototype Example: Service Journey

Common prototyping methods

Using paper Good for spelling out your ideas, any idea

Using a table top Good for testing logic, flow, interactions, seeing how a system (might) work

Using frameworks Good for capturing the whole idea, process or system

Examples: Service Blueprint, Theory of Change, Business Model Canvas

Using scenarios Good for thinking through an idea, comparisons, or futuring

Tip: Use across different time horizons, geographies or demographics

Using acting Good for testing a process, interaction or experience

At full-scale prototype helps operationalise an idea and work out all the details
